Rice University Courses for High School Students

RiceEDGE is a selective program for motivated students to prepare for success in the nation's best colleges and universities. Students have several enrichment options:

- RiceEDGE Summer School offers students a full preview of college life. Students will engage in an undergraduate level course taught by Rice faculty, earn college credits, and experience life on campus with a diverse and talented cohort of fellow students. Students who choose the residential option will also live in one of Rice's nationally renowned residential colleges for the duration of the program (5 weeks). Courses available include Biochemistry and Cell Biology (with optional lab course) and New Frontiers in Film, Literature, Culture, and Digital Technologies, an interdisciplinary seminar with a focus on developing college-level writing and communication skills.
- RiceEDGE Enrichment courses offer students shorter but equally rigorous opportunities for intellectual and personal growth. In this inaugural summer, students can choose an intensive exploration of the refugee crisis and humanitarian assistance; an innovative leader development series led by the Director of the Doerr Institute for New Leaders; a cutting-edge introduction to computer science and programming in Java; or a humanities seminar on genius, madness, and creativity in the arts.


